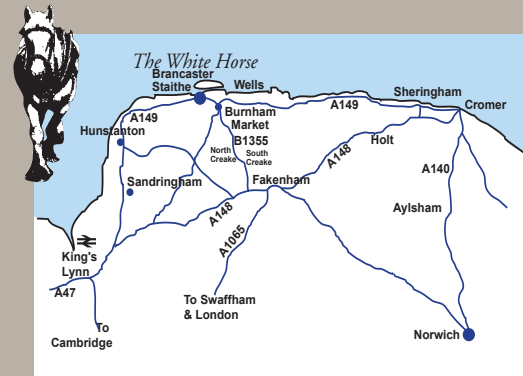

The fifteen en-suite bedrooms are spacious in design with contemporary furnishings and décor.
