Every day, Winter Bird Feed, Pensthorpe Reserve, near Fakenham (15.6miles from TWH)

Walking anytime The coastline around Brancaster Staithe has plenty of opportunities for walking - from a stroll along the coastal path before breakfast to a more adventurous 44-mile trek to Cromer - there is something for everyone. To fully appreciate the big skies of Norfolk, head to the beach at Brancaster or Holkham; both are dog friendly, but check the tides. Pink-footed geese fly overhead in their thousands during the winter months. This amazing sight occurs around dawn each morning when the geese fly from Scolt Head Island to feed on the local fields. They then return to their roost sites along the coast each evening. The pink-footed geese do not breed in the UK, but large numbers spend the winter here from their breeding ground in Iceland and Greenland.
